
According to the type of bank, we have several initial anchoring solutions to meet your needs for safe access.


3. Determine your incline variation


- Shallow

According to your needs, we have several possible configurations to achieve the desired distance.




How to choose your dock

1. Starting walkway - depending on access, shoreline and required distance



Standing dock: Starting on the bank with posts at all four corners of the walkway





Semi-floating dock: Start on the bank with two posts, followed by a float at the end of the walkway

2. Walkway - depending on your choice of starting walkway



Standing dock: Can be joined to another standing dock only



Semi-floating dock: Can be joined to a standing dock and serves as a transition between standing and floating docks



Floating dock: Can be joined to a semi-floating dock only

3. Platform - depending on your choise of walkway



Standing dock: Can be joined to another standing dock only



Floating dock: Can be joined to a semi-floating or floating walkway
